NOTES

- Type A -** The articles covered by this Certificate are wholly grown, produced or manufactured in the Philippines. No foreign materials were used at any stage in the manufacture or production of such materials.
- Type B -** The foreign material content of the articles is ascertainable and therefore it should be indicated.
- Type C -** The exact foreign material content is not ascertainable. However, its estimated value in relation to the ex-factory price should be indicated.

To illustrate how the exporter may accomplish this form.

Circumstances of production or manufacture	Insert in "Origin Criterion"
A. Goods wholly produced and worked on in the Philippines.	"A" followed by CCCN (BTN) heading of the exported goods. Example: "A" 74 07
B. Goods worked on but not wholly produced in the Philippines and the exact value of import content is known	"B" followed by CCCN (BTN) heading. Indicate also in parenthesis the percentage value of import content relative to ex-factory price. Example: "B" 73 15 (15%)
C. Goods worked on but not wholly produced in the Philippines and the value of import content is only estimated.	"C" followed by CCCN (BTN) heading. Indicate in parenthesis the approximate percentage value of foreign materials relative to ex-factory price. Example: "C" 98 02 (less than 20%)
